# Deck, balcony and window safety guideline

### **Purpose**

To advise a new guideline for decks, balconies and window safety has been released.

## **Background**

In recent years across Australia there have been a number of deck collapses and falls from buildings. Coronial reports regularly recommended that buildings be checked for safety.

This is particularly important for occupiers of homes with timber decks and balconies (especially those built before the 1940s). The guideline decks, balconies and window safety can be used to help occupiers check that their buildings are safe for the festive season.

#### Issues

To help promote the safety message, Growth Management Queensland has developed the *Deck, balcony and window safety guideline*. The guideline has been prepared to assist building owners and occupiers carry out safety inspections on balustrades, decks and balconies. It also includes useful advice about safety issues associated with elevated floors and opening windows. The aim of the guideline is to help minimise the risk of further collapses, falls and injuries by making owners and tenants aware of the risks associated with poorly maintained decks and balconies.

Owners and occupiers, especially those preparing for celebrations during the festive season, are encouraged to use the guideline to inspect their decks and balconies to identify any areas requiring maintenance. It is important to take action to address maintenance risks early.
