Partnering for Impact

• In March 2018, the Minister of Housing and Public Works launched Partnering for Impact to reduce homelessness in Queensland (Partnering for Impact) complementing the Queensland Housing Strategy 2017 – 2027.

Partnering for Impact:

- demonstrates the Queensland Government's commitment to broaden our partnerships with the homelessness sector
- outlines the intent to provide existing service providers and their workforces with the certainty and stability they need by locking in five year funding to deliver vital services to Queenslanders that are homeless, or at risk of homelessness, whilst driving innovation and transforming the homelessness sector

Key principles

 Partnerships – Networking, coordination, collaboration and cooperation.

 Person-Centred - Contemporary responses, personcentred service system and person-centred outcomes.

 Place Based - User-led design, integrated environments, evidence informed design.






The Queensland Homelessness Compact Workplan 2018 - 2020

Partnering Process

- Relationships & Networks- Partnering for Impact emphasises the government commitment to working collaboratively with the sector to produce innovative and effective housing and homelessness responses.
- Exploration- New products and services will be trialled and evaluated.
- Co-design- We are implementing new initiatives and working groups in collaboration with other agencies, service providers, industries and communities.

Partnering Process (cont'd)

- Action We are delivering on our commitment by providing personcentred and contemporary housing responses and expanding homelessness prevention through early intervention strategies.
- Reflection Re-thinking pathways to homelessness allows us to address at-risk and emerging cohort needs. We will reflect on our current service delivery approaches to ensure that support is available to those who need it
- Transition Fostering a more holistic and person centred approach, building on existing responses for innovation and improved housing outcomes.
